

S73-5 ALL-UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS (WRITTEN, ORAL AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS) Amended by F96-12

The Academic Council passed the following modifications in the all-University requirements as presented by Dr. Theodore Norton, Chairman of the Curriculum Committee. (Passed: Meeting of 2/26/73)

ALL-UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

S 73-5 (includes changes mandated by F96-12)

RESOLVED, that the all-university requirements stated on page 71 of the 1972/74 General Catalog be modified to read as follows:

WRITTEN COMMUNICATION REQUIREMENT

All students are required to complete a course in English composition. Most students will satisfy this requirement by taking English 1A.

ORAL COMMUNICATION REQUIREMENT

Students who matriculate at this university in the lower division without certification of completion of general education are required to complete a course in oral communication. Most students will satisfy this requirement by taking one of the following courses: Speech Communication 10, 20, 40, 55, 110, 120, or 140.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT (*edited per F96-12)

Students who matriculate at this university in the lower division are required to complete two units of physical education activity courses. (Upon recommendation of advisers in the Student Health Service, special Physical Education courses are arranged to meet the needs of handicapped students.)

Waivers may be allowed to the Physical Education requirement on a case by case basis, as with all other courses.

That course work equivalencies for this requirement will be established by the Human Performance faculty prior to the implementation of this policy.
