At its meeting of May 13, 1996, the Academic Senate approved the following Sense of the Senate Resolution presented by Tom Jordan for the Instruction and Student Affairs Committee.

WIDER DISSEMINATION OF STUDENT INFORMATION

Whereas the information contained in the recently published Student Handbook is excellent and could be an enormous help to all students but distribution of the handbook is limited because of the cost associated with printing it and

Whereas the information in the Handbook should be in a format that can be updated as often as each semester and

Whereas the handbook refers students to the Schedule of Classes for dates, etc., and the Handbook often duplicates information contained in the Schedule and

Whereas students surveyed agree that they would like to have this information in a useful if not so pretty form rather than not have it, and

Whereas it would be possible to add the information vital to students from the Handbook to the Schedule by adding 10 to 15 pages to the current Schedule and

Whereas students surveyed felt strongly that the information's availability in the Schedule would justify a higher price for the Schedule; therefore be it

Resolved that all appropriate information from the Student Handbook be added to the Schedule of Classes effective with the Spring, 1997 Class Schedule, and be it further

Resolved that what is appropriate will be determined by the Registrar in consultation with the Instruction and Student Affairs committee, and be it further

Resolved that each Schedule shall contain a feedback form inviting student comments and suggestions on content; and be it further

Resolved that the Schedule and its contents shall be reviewed annually by the Instruction and Student Affairs Committee; and be it further

Resolved that the Schedule be three-hole punched so it can be added to the students' three-ring binder and be it finally

Resolved that the price of the Schedule be raised minimally to cover the additional cost incurred in making the information readily available and the Schedule more useful for students.
