Number of meetings held: Meetings for this committee were mostly online.

There were weekly, bi-monthly, or monthly communications.

We met once at SJSU to conduct vote counting for Senate representatives election: 2 units proceeded with elections.

Items of Business Completed 2004/2005

We had to work on filling up vacancies at the Senate (March 2005), and throughout the year in the Senate Committees (June 2004- May 2005).

When we began AY 2004-2005, there were 77 committee vacancies. By the closing of Chair Maldonado-Colón's term there were only 30 openings left for this academic year. Committee members were very active in recruiting representatives of their colleges. Recruitment to fill the last 30 vacancies did not yield expected results. Perhaps we need to look into what would be other ways to recruit faculty to represent their unit.

At the beginning of AY 2004-05, only two colleges had not selected yet their Committee on Committees representatives. However, once this was done, the number of vacancies in their unit was reduced significantly.

Committee preference forms were sent out to the units in Spring for AY 2005-06. The ones received by the beginning of May were processed, and brought to the Senate for approval.

Unfinished Business Items for 2004/2005

In addition to filling vacancies, we had to explore the feasibility of online elections for Academic Senate representation. Copy of the beginning and ending reports on vacancies for 04/05 are attached. So is the report and recommendations on online voting.

Hi Mary Jo,

As Annette mentioned to you a while ago, the Senate is interested in exploring the possibility of establishing a system of online voting for elections. I went ahead and explored some options. The two that I recommend to be studied are:

- a. CSU San Marcos, and
- b. a commercial enterprise who does this for associations: contact is Robert Claus (referred by Jim Schmidt).
 - A. will come free to us to adopt and adapt, the contact is Jay Rees.
 - B. is a business with a price tag-- undetermined at this point since he needs details from us before he can price it.

I am attaching the memo I sent Annette.

My contact at CSU San Marcos was Marcia Woolf, who is the Academic Senate Coordinator:

(760) 750-4058. She got me in touch with Jay at (760) 750-4774. Maybe he and Paul Nozicka should have a conversation on the requirements and shortcomings as well as strengths of the system. Marcia seemed to be pleased with it.

Sonoma seems to have a system, however, Zoomerang is expensive.

Concerns that our committee had:

- a. Who keeps tabs of the % of faculty appointments? Who certifies it?
- b. How is the vote count reported? It is an extra charge?
- c. What is an appropriate window for the voting period? Could it be the same as we now have?
- d. Can paper copies be done too? (For faculty averse to technology.)
- e. How is confidentiality assured?
- f. How does the system control for one-time voting, and for corrections?
- g. Where do the votes go?
- h. Who enters the names of the candidates?
- i. How does the system handle faculty/staff with split assignments (across units or colleges), or those who represent another college?
- j. Will we get a printout (for the record) that reflects total no. of votes, and collegewide votes?

I hope this questions help Paul, or the person you designate to help us explore further the feasibility of adopting such a system.

Re: Online voting

As required by our charge, I have been investigating the possibility of online voting for SJSU. The results are mixed.

First, I polled the committee members to see if anyone had experience with online voting and how they felt. Most members indicated they had not.

Second, I conferred with one member who responded that for her it was very positive.

Third, another member referred me to Jim Schmidt who connected me with an agency/company that does national elections for different associations. I followed up on this one. His information is included: Robert Claus.

I also pursued information given to me by Terri Thames, and was successful with CSU San Marcos. They have a template that needs to be cleaned but can be shared free to a member of our Instructional Technology Dept. to adapt it to SJSU, and place it on our server. Contact is Jay Rees at: obs@csusm.edu.

What needs to happen:

We need to identify the purpose(s) for online voting, and delimit those purposes so that we can get an estimate on cost..


We also need to think about how we would handle part-timers and other faculty with fractions of appointments, and cross-departmental appointments.

We need to approach IT to see if they would be interested in pursuing and refining Jim's project instead of us paying for a commercial system.

That's the beauty of the password system. It was very easy and fast. There were links to each person's name explaining their background and platform. At the end it showed you the summary of your votes and gave you a chance to edit them before hitting the submit button.

There are profs on campus who do on-line surveys that are exactly like electronic voting. They usually rent space on a server for that purpose, which doesn't sound very expensive. But we would need a way to email/mail everyone a pin number prior to the election. If the payroll office had a complete list of faculty, someone could generate random numbers to assign pin numbers. Or we could piggy back and use the pin numbers that the library already has assigned (assuming all profs use the library, which could be a mistaken assumption). I think those numbers tend to be their phone extensions, which are not very private. 

Have anyone come up with helpful suggestions or actions regarding electronic voting? Do you think we can pull it off this year?

Web Voting Tips To Getting Started

- 1 Review the rules. Electronic voting now is permitted by law if your not-for-profit organization is chartered in Illinois, but your own bylaws may need to be changed before you can proceed.
- 2 Consider your culture. Are your members generally tech-savvy, late adopters, or somewhere in between? For what percentage do you have valid e-mail addresses? Your members' experience and comfort level with working online will affect how (and how quickly) you will make the transition.
- 3 Understand The Security Behind The Process. Security comes in two forms, the process not to allow double voting by a member(s), and the security behind the web-site.
- 4 Prepare to communicate thoroughly. Member satisfaction with online voting tends to be very high—so long as members know what to expect. Prepare a communications program that will tell members in advance what you're doing and what it means for them.
- 5 Expect a transition period. Online voting is simple, but it takes some time for members to adapt to any new routine. For a time, expect to offer paper ballots for those who either can't or choose not to vote online. Provide assistance for members as they get used to the new process—and ensure they know you appreciate the importance of their voting privilege.

Options—

- Who votes here*
- 1) all vote online
 - 2) Only full time tenured, tenure track and full-time part-timers vote on line
Others vote by paper ballot.
 - 3) Provide support system — back up for those who can't vote online (e.g. — system is down)
 - 4) Advertise with plenty of time
 - 5) verify e-mail addresses for voting period

and prevent unauthorized access. For instance, the election website application has been programmed and tested by third-party certified security professionals to defend against hacking vulnerabilities such as session hijacking, SQL injection, and cross-site scripting. D) The website server and its applications have gone through extensive hardening and testing for security and are maintained continuously to ward off new vulnerabilities. E) The voting data are stored at the secure data center with controlled, monitored access 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

Which browsers can be used to vote on the Web?

Most leading Web browsers such as Internet Explorer and Netscape can be used to vote on the Web. However, if you are using an older version of a Web browser, you should update your software to use the voting Web site. Software updates can typically be found from the manufacturer free of charge on the Web.

What happens if a member votes on the Web and also votes through the mail?

Votes obtained from the Web and from paper are combined into a single database and are associated with the member ID. Duplicate IDs are identified and removed based on criteria established by the organization holding the election.

Maybe dates will be reference points for selection.

2004-2005 Year-End Committee Report Form

Number of meetings held: Meetings for this committee were mostly online.

There were weekly, bi-monthly, or monthly communications.

We met once at SJSU to conduct vote counting for Senate representatives election: 2 units proceeded with elections.

Items of Business Completed 2004/2005

We had to work on filling up vacancies at the Senate (March 2005), and throughout the year in the Senate Committees (June 2004- May 2005).

When we began AY 2004-2005, there were 77 committee vacancies. By the closing of Chair Maldonado-Colón's term there were only 30 openings left for this academic year. Committee members were very active in recruiting representatives of their colleges. Recruitment to fill the last 30 vacancies did not yield expected results. Perhaps we need to look into what would be other ways to recruit faculty to represent their unit.

At the beginning of AY 2004-05, only two colleges had not selected yet their Committee on Committees representatives. However, once this was done, the number of vacancies in their unit was reduced significantly.

Committee preference forms were sent out to the units in Spring for AY 2005-06. The ones received by the beginning of May were processed, and brought to the Senate for approval.

Unfinished Business Items for 2004/2005

In addition to filling vacancies, we had to explore the feasibility of online elections for Academic Senate representation. Copy of the beginning and ending reports on vacancies for 04/05 are attached. So is the report and recommendations on online voting.
