Placements include situations where sociologists are employed, or where sociological knowledge may be applied, tested, or obtained. Such placements might be work in corrections, mental health, work with youth or the aged, elected officials, or with community groups, business or industry. Teaching internships can be arranged either within the department or at a junior college. (This list is only suggestive of the variety of possible placements).
