We improved graduation rates in three categories in 2017.


14.5 percent of incoming freshman from the class of 2014 completed their degrees in four years.

27 percent of transfer students complete a degree in two years.

73 percent of transfer students complete a degree in four years.

We have increased the number of students taking 15 or more units a semester, the amount required to stay on track for a four-year degree.

47 percent of freshmen registered for 15+ units last fall compared to 14 percent in fall 2015.





We have hired 30 new staff advisors, improving our professional advisor to student ratio from

1 per 1,000 to 1 per 500.

We have launched Faculty-in-Residence and Faculty Fellows programs that support students outside of the classroom.






By 2025, we strive to eliminate our equity gap and Pell-eligible gap.

In 2017, our equity gap was at 13 percent and our Pell-eligible gap was at 5 percent.











What new strategies did you learn today that seem most relevant to student success at SJSU?






If you could implement one change at SJSU to improve student success, what would it be?




