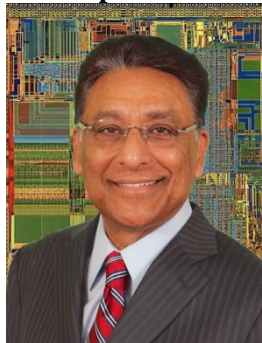
Yousuf has two undergraduate degrees from the University of California, Berkeley – in Business Administration from the Walter Haas School of Business and in Molecular and Cell Biology.

#### Guest Speaker's Bio:



**Vinod Dham** is an inventor, entrepreneur and venture capitalist. He is popularly known as the Father of the Pentium chip, for his contribution to the development of highly successful Pentium Processors from Intel. He is a mentor, advisor and investor; and sits on the boards of many companies including promising startups funded through his India based fund – Indo US Venture Partners where he is the founding Managing Director.

After graduation in Electrical Engineering (with an emphasis in Electronics) from the prestigious Delhi College of Engineering (now known as Delhi Technological University) in 1971, he joined a Delhi-based semiconductor company called Continental Devices. In 1975, he left this job and joined University of Cincinnati in Cincinnati, Ohio, to pursue a master's degree in Electrical Engineering, where he specialized in Solid State Science. After completing his master's degree in 1977, he joined NCR Corporation at Dayton, Ohio, where he did cutting edge work in developing advanced Non-Volatile Memories. He then joined

Intel, where he led the development of the world famous Pentium processor. He is called the "Father of Pentium" for his role in the development of the Pentium processor. He is also one of the co-inventors of Intel's first Flash memory technology (ETOX). He rose to the position of vice-president of the Microprocessor Group at Intel.

He left Intel in 1995, and joined a startup NexGen, which was subsequently acquired by AMD. Dham played an instrumental role in the launch of K6 – the "Pentium killer" processor at rival AMD. He held vice president position of AMD's Computation Products Group. He then went on to lead a nascent startup, Silicon Spice in April 1998, which he redirected to build a VOIP Chip and later sold it to Broadcom in 2000. He then launched an incubator NewPath Ventures, where he co – founded companies with an objective of using India's emerging talent in chip design for R&D. He is currently a Managing Director and founder of Indo US Venture Partners, an early stage India focused fund that he founded after NewPath. Dham has over the years been a Board member and an advisor to dozens of private and public companies.

<b>Guest Speaker's Bio:</b>	<p><b>Dr. William F. Miller</b> is Herbert Hoover Professor of Public and Private Management Emeritus and Professor of Computer Science Emeritus at Stanford University; Co-Director, Stanford Program, Regions of Innovation and Entrepreneurship; President Emeritus, SRI International; Chairman Emeritus, Borland Software Corporation; and Chairman/Founder of Nanostellar, Inc. He has spent about half of his professional life in business and about half in academia. He was the last faculty member recruited to Stanford University by the legendary Frederick Terman, who was then Vice President and Provost of Stanford. Miller himself later became Vice President and Provost of Stanford. He conducted research and directed many graduate students in Computer Science.</p> <p>In 1968 Dr. Miller also played a role in the founding of the first Mayfield Fund (venture capital) as a special limited partner and advisor to the general partners. As President and CEO of SRI International (1979-1990) Miller opened SRI to the Pacific Region; he established the spin-out and commercialization program at SRI and established the David Sarnoff Research Center (now the Sarnoff Corporation) as a for-profit subsidiary of SRI, and he became the Chairman and CEO of SRI.</p> <p>In 1982 Miller was appointed to the National Science Board. He has served on the board of directors of several major companies such as Signetics, Firemans Fund Insurance, First Interstate Bank (and later) Wells Fargo Bank, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Varian Associates, and Borland Software Corp. (Chairman).</p> <p>He co-founded SmartValley, Inc. and aided the formation of CommerceNet and serves on the board of directors. Dr. Miller was a founding director of the Center for Excellence in Non-profits. He currently serves as Chairman of the Board of Sentius Corporation and is a Founder and Chairman of Nanostellar, Inc.</p> <p>Dr. Miller is a Life Member of the National Academy of Engineering, Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Science, Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Life Fellow of IEEE, and Member of the Silicon Valley Engineering Hall of Fame.</p>

**Munjal Shah** is a serial entrepreneur with a passion for building great companies. He currently serves as an Entrepreneur-In-Residence at Charles River Ventures. Mr. Shah was co-founder and CEO of two E-Commerce companies, Like.com (sold to Google) and Andale (sold to Vendio/Alibaba). Munjal is also an investor and/or advisor to a number of Internet companies including Meebo (sold to Google), Aupytma (sold to Oracle), MesmoTV (sold to GSN), Kabam, TaskRabbit, Pubmatic, RocketFuel, Counsyl, Refresh.io, Concept.io, SpotOn, and many more. Prior to embarking on his entrepreneurial career, Mr. Shah led the Internet Marketing and E-commerce Group for the Baan Company and also led product management and marketing activities for BlackSun Interactive. At IBM, Mr. Shah worked with the initial home banking applications group and was part of the team that brought Nation's Bank and Bank of America into the online home banking business for the first time, at the start of the Internet revolution. He was nominated as one of the top 10 "Up and Comers" in Business week in 2001. Mr. Shah holds a M.S. in Computer Science from Stanford University and B.S. in Computer Science from the University California, San Diego.
