

CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT

Prority Deadline: April 1st

Who can apply?

Undergraduate and graduate undocumented students who meet the requirements for AB 540 (CA Non-Resident Tuition Exemption).

This includes students who have/are: Undocumented (without a SSN), DACA, asylum seeker, SIJS, TPS, U or T Visa

We understand the unique challenges immigrant students and their families face, and our curated list of resources aims to provide clear and accessible information. From step-by-step guides on filling out the applications to FAQs addressing common concerns, our goal is to empower students to pursue their educational goals. FAFSA updates for Non-SSN Parents: Students with parents who do not have an SSN are still experiencing multiple barriers to completing a FAFSA including account creation, identity verification, and trouble accessing the application. Unfortunately, there is no timeline from the US Department of Education about when these issues will be resolved. Students and families can sign up to receive a follow-up from the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) on the status of FAFSA for Non-SSN contributors

2024-25 SJSU Spartan Scholarships NOW OPEN

The Financial Aid and Scholarship Office administers three types of scholarships: SJSU campus scholarships, department scholarships, and private scholarships.

Students should apply for as many scholarships as possible to lessen the need for loans or parttime work to attend school.

The deadlines operate on a rolling basis, with a final cutoff date set for May 1st

*About Department Scholarships: Various academic departments on campus manage their own scholarships. Students are strongly encouraged to keep in close contact with their major department for scholarship information. These scholarships each have their own specific criteria, deadlines, and application instructions. Students should contact their department directly for additional information.

Sacramento Region Community Foundation Scholarships (up to \$10,000)

Undergraduates and graduate students may apply. See the site for scholarship-specific requirements.

Undergraduates and graduate students may apply. Must be in specific STEM field. See the site for requirements.

Must be Latinx; show financial need; graduated from a specific Northern California High School; 3.0 GPA.

Identify as Chicana and/or Latina; from eligible county; undergraduate and Graduate students; full-time enrollment.





Attention DACA recipients!

Due to delays in DACA renewals, USCIS advises applicants to renew their DACA status within the 6-5 months before it expires. SJSU students, recent alumni, staff, faculty, and their direct family members have access to free immigration services to receive assistance with the renewal process.
